

Dear Parents,

The Governing Board is made up, largely, of local people who are all acting as volunteers. Our role is to "have three core functions:

1. Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction; 2. Holding the headteacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils, and the performance management of staff; and 3. Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent."

Basically our job is to provide the checks and balances as 'a critical friend' of the school. We meet formally at least six times a year, attend training provided by The Warriner Multi-Academy Trust (WMAT) and Oxfordshire Partners in Learning, as well as other Governor meetings within the WMAT. We are hoping to raise our profile within the school over the next year and so hope to be more visible so that everyone knows who we are and what we do as Governors.



PE This term in PE we have been doing netball. We even moved on to High 5s. We have really enjoyed using learning about netball and the different passes needed for a game.



MAPLE & OAK


We have had such a lovely term with lots of learning and things going on. On returning from Condover Hall, Oak Class visited the Remembrance exhibition at the village hall. This really was a *local* history lesson and there were lots of facts and information about Sibford and the school which were so interesting to learn. Many thanks to ex-governor Maureen Hicks for inviting us and taking the time to talk.





We took part in National Parliament week this November and both Maple and Oak studied the suffragette movement which they were very enthusiastic about. They produced some amazing research posters (using a range of sources) in readiness for writing a biography about Emmeline Pankhurst.





Year 4 in Science have been looking at the human digestive system and have produced some thoughtful and detailed artwork illustrating this, and consolidating their learning about the different parts of this system. They have also been finding about teeth and have conducted a practical experiment to explore the effect of different liquids on tooth enamel, using eggs, coca-cola, vinegar, fruit juice, milk and salt water, with some important lessons learned!

Macbeth Drama Workshops 22.11.18

We were lucky enough to have The Young Shakespeare Company, visiting our school this term. The children absolutely loved it and it was a truly memorable learning experience for them all. Prior to the workshops, the children in Willow, Maple and Oak Classes had spent some weeks exploring aspects of the play 'Macbeth'.





The workshops served as a wonderful finale for this work as the children acted out the whole story and became immersed in the richness of Shakespeare's language. The children brought the day as well as a lot of prior knowledge about Macbeth which this was commented on by Andrew, the actor who led the workshops. It was such a joy to see all the children taking part in such a memorable and enjoyable learning experience.



OAK CLASS ART & DESIGN



In Oak Class, the children have been creating their own 'Folk Art'. We started off the half-term with a focus on mark-making and explored and experimented with a variety of ways in which we can create interesting textures and patterns with drawing implements. Then we looked at examples of Folk Art from different cultures and considered definitions of 'folk art'. The children then combined mark-making and imagination to create their own folk art images using the motif of flowers.

The finished works are really beautiful!



YEAR SIX SCIENCE



Year 6 have been looking at the topic of electricity this term in science. Over the last few week they have been using their knowledge of circuits to create Christmas decorations. They have had to design their decorations and then make them using batteries, bulb holders, bulbs and wire. Over the last couple of sessions they have had to use problem-solving

AMAZING MATHS



Earlier this term, eight year sixes attempted the Primary Maths Challenge. We went into the hall and took the test. Here are a couple of questions from the test for you to try:
