MFL at Foundation Stage and KS1

<u>Approach</u>

A whole school approach to MFL is desirable, and although languages at Foundation Stage and KS1 are not statutory, Sibford Gower Endowed Primary School now teaches French from Foundation Stage through until the end of KS2.

Aims and Objectives

The aims of learning a foreign language at Foundation Stage/KS1 are the same for those at KS2:

- Foster an interest in learning another language
- Introduce young learners to a different rich language environment in a way that is enjoyable and fun
- Stimulate and encourage learner's curiosity about language
- Encourage learners to be aware that language has structure and that structures differ from one language to another
- Help learners to understand cultural differences in other countries
- Develop their speaking and listening skills

The scheme of work for MFL at Foundation Stage/KS1 will give the children a basic grounding in French and will complement the scheme of work for MFL at KS2. At KS1 the children will be introduced to all 4 areas of language learning (Speaking and Listening, Reading, Writing and Grammar) but in an age/stage appropriate way.

Recording and Assessment

Formal assessment is not a feature of languages at Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1. A record of some of each pupil's work, in the form of, e.g. photographs, sound recordings and displays, together with simple 'I can do' statements will be kept in the form of a 'Language Scrapbook' to celebrate the children's achievements in MFL. In addition, planning for Acorn class will include clear references to the EYFS to show links between the children's activities in French and their EYFS profile.
