We have explored volcanoes through work in all areas of the curriculum.



Maple Class News

As the year draws to a close, Maple Class has erupted into volcanic action...

Maths

Theme Park mania has spread across Years 4, 5 and even 6, as the children have embarked on a project to create and manage their own theme park. This has involved calculating set-up costs and profit and loss accounts, as well as creating maps and logos. As usual, their teamwork has been brilliant.



Topic We have been learning all about plate tectonics this term. While the children's topic homework focussed on earthquakes, we have been studying how the earth's crust is split into plates and how they move around. We demonstrated the three types of plate boundary using Oreo biscuits! The main outcome of the term's study, however, will be the volcano project, which has involved pupils from across all three KS2 classes designing and building their very own erupting volcano! We look forward to setting these off in the last couple of days of term



English

After finishing the thrilling Shiver, we have moved on to The Firework Maker's Daughter as our final class reader, tying in nicely with the theme of volcanoes. Big Writing themes have included narrative poetry, myths and legends and a review of the year. The final round of topic homework presentations have been delivered beautifully, many of them to an extremely high standard.



We began with Kwik Cricket, as many of the children were involved in competitions, reaching the Oxfordshire finals in Years 5 and 6. We have also welcomed Commonwealth Gold medallist badminton player Julie Bradbury to the school this term. She ran a great morning of badminton for the children in Key Stage 2. As the term and the year draws to a close, we are gearing up for a final mini Maple football league, with all to play for...


