In KS2, we have welcomed staff from the Oxford Museum to run practical workshops with the children to support and enrich their topic work on the themes of Stone Age to Iron Age, and Ancient Greece.


#### **FAREWELL FRED!**

### **ACORN CLASS NEWS**



A sukkah is a temporary hut constructed for use during the week-long Jewish festival of Sukkot.

It is topped with branches and often decorated with autumnal, harvest or Judaic themes commemorating the time God provided for the Israelites in the wilderness they inhabited after they were freed from slavery in Egypt.





# **Autumn Day in Willow Class**

We have taken full of advantage of the beautiful autumnal weather. We decided to have a whole day to explore this season. We created some beautiful artwork and writing!

The children (and grown-ups) had a wonderful day and we all agreed that 'Autumn' is one of our favourite seasons.

Throughout the term, the children have continued to use and enjoy their sketch books. These are 'owned' by the children and they are able to use their creativity to 'sketch' pieces they choose.











#### **Archimedes Screw**


#### We had great fun, working collaboratively, to make and then test our Archimedes' Screws

As part of a lovely learning day, and in keeping with their topic theme of Ancient Greece, we explored the story of Persephone and the Seasons. The children explored rich vocabulary and wrote creatively to describe Hades' Underworld and Demeter's Earth. We then explored a real pomegranate, tasting the seeds as poor Persephone did! The children used pastels to create some really beautiful drawings of our pomegranate.
