It seems hard to believe that we are already one sixth of the way through the academic year. It has been a very positive start to the year. Our new teachers, Miss Roseblade and Miss Grantham have settled in quickly and all sorts of exciting learning has been taking place across the school.

There have been more improvements to our school site as well. Thanks to our PTA and Town Estates, Old School has now been fully re-carpeted and looks much smarter. Town Estates have also given significant additional financial support which has enabled us to rebuild the wall around the Old school classroom. This means that we can proceed to Stage 2 of developing this area into a safe and stimulating outdoor classroom directly accessible from each of the Key Stage 2 classrooms. During the half term holiday, we are re-roofing the conservatory in Acorn classroom as part of our programme of site development across the school. We need to thank WMAT colleagues for coordinating the grant application for this work.

Our new WMAT caretaker Mr Wiggins is busy on site each morning, ensuring that the site is safe for the children and making all sorts of improvements.

Next term is likely to be just as exciting. The Year 5 & 6 children are off for their residential trip to Condover Hall in Shropshire. While they are gone, we have plans for a whole school cross-curricular project in school, with children from different age groups working together indoors and outside, in addition to their core learning in literacy and maths. The feedback from the children is that they

love these projects so we intend to ensure that they continue to be a regular feature of our curriculum.



As part of this, we have found out about British values and linked this to developing our class rules and thinking about what makes us as individuals and special as a class. We have all really enjoyed looking at our large floor maps and discussing places in the United Kingdom that we have visited or lived in.

The children have shown real talent in art and design this term. We have created fantastic self-portraits in a variety of media and then discussed each medium's strengths. In English we have been reading lots of stories with familiar settings and have enjoyed discussing these and acting them out. We visited the orchard and used our imaginations to think about what we might see, hear, smell, taste and touch in the Gruffalo's wood!

In maths we have been developing our understanding of number through ordering numbers, looking for patterns, and finding out facts about two and three digit numbers.



We have also all been working hard on our "Learn its" and using real life objects to help us with multiplication. One group even pegged out the socks of some of our favourite characters to help them to develop their counting in twos.




We really enjoyed our DT lessons- WE GOT TO MAKE OUR VERY OWN EGYPTIAN CLAY POTS.

# **Maple Class News**

The start to this year has been a proper rollercoaster ride - it's difficult to believe that only one term has gone by. Here are some of the highlights...

#### Maths

The children have been getting up to speed with their mental maths in CLIC, as well as doing a lot of other intensive number work. There have been weekly problems to solve, the return of the Cloak of Divisibility (while exercising our French) and carrying out investigations involving estimating and calculating a range of different measures.

# Computing

It has been great to see what Purple Mash has to offer, and we are now on a mission to revamp our blog with exciting news stories brought straight to you from our intrepid Maple Class reporters...



#### Art & Design

We've been out foraging for materials to make our own natural paint (which got quite stinky), and the children have been using it to make designs on papyrus. We've also been making our own Egyptian cartouches with names written in hieroglyphs.



# English

Our class novel this term has been *The Red Pyramid* by Rick Riordan, which has added a lot to our learning about Ancient Egypt. In Big Writing, the children have written diary entries for their trip to the Ashmolean Museum and fabulous nonsense poems, reports for the Maple blog and descriptions about the autumn. Meanwhile, The Grammar Game is back, and competition is already fierce!



P.E. We've been making the most of being outside this term, and we've been focussing on team tactics, fair play and communication in our work on tag rugby and football. It's been great to see some of the fantastic results of this in recent football and tag rugby tournaments, in which some of our Maple people have been involved!



It's been all about Evolution and Inheritance this term, which has mainly involved the Year 5 children studying beaks, looking at what Charles Darwin found out about beaks, carrying out an investigation with our own versions of beaks... as well as looking at how other animals have evolved and why the Galápagos Islands are such a special place.

#### Topic

With the theme of Ancient Egypt, the job of Maple Class has been to look at gods and beliefs - mainly learning about what happens in the afterlife. It turns out that there are one or two fairly unpleasant Ancient Egyptian gods... We've made a whole-class scale map of Ancient Egypt, which has pride of place in our classroom. We've been looking at pyramids, mummies, canopic jars and cartouches... and, of course, the curse of Tutankhamun...



Oak Class News

In PE the children have been working hard developing team work and multi -skills, with a focus on Tag Rugby. We have been supported by sports coaches from Ignite who have helped to ensure that the children are developing skills at a high level and are working alongside teachers to further develop best practice.



Year 6 Science

This half term the Y6 children have been finding out about the planets and space. Here are some paintings of the planets drawn to scale. We have had great fun creating these, with the children collaborating well and applying their mathematics to ensure their

scaled drawings are accurate as well as having an excuse to get the paints and brushes out. Now these are finished we will be displaying them in the classroom.



## Oak Class Assembly

For their class assembly, the children showed a selection of things they have been involved in over this half term. These have included: sketching in the Pissarro gallery at the Ashmolean museum, painting a life size picture of Queen Cleopatra, sharing some interesting vocabulary, performing an original Egyptian rap and explaining the process of mummification.





Our Y1 & 2 girls came 1st in the Warriner Partnership Cross Country Race which took place at The Warriner School. All the girls took part and did an amazing job.



A special mention for Olivia, Bella, Ruby and Esme who all came in the top 11, and Flora who attained a very impressive 18th place even though only in Year 1. Well done!



Total Recall is an initiative we are introducing after the half-term holiday to encourage the children to develop the quick recall of number facts that is essential if they are to be successful within the new National Curriculum for maths. The children are awarded different colour button badges when they reach certain milestones (in order):

#### **Numbers**

**Orange**: number bonds to 10 (e.g.9+1, 3+7)

Yellow: one more and one less to 20 (e.g. one more

than 15, one less than 12)

**Green:** number bonds to 20(e.g. 18+2, 5+15) **Pink:** number bonds to 100 (e.g.54+46, 33+67)

#### **Tables**

**Bronze:** 2,5,10 times tables (up to 12x) **Silver:** 3,6,4,8 times tables (up to 12x) **Gold:** 7,9,11 times tables (up to 12x)

Black: 12 times table and TOTAL RECALL of all previous

tables and number bonds.

The expectation in the new National curriculum is that all children should know their 2x, 5x and 10x tables by the end of Year 2 and all tables up to 12x12 by the end of Year 4.

CHILDREN MUST PRACTISE AT HOME. They must be quizzed by their class teacher for each badge and Mr Lecznar, Miss Blake or Ms O'Sullivan will double check their fingertip quick number facts for speed and accuracy before a badge is awarded.

Once the children have achieved these badges, there are more to come...

RECALL OF ALL TIMES TABLES AND

All our children have had the opportunity to vote for their school council class representatives. The WOMBATS have been duly elected and we have already managed to hold three meetings.
