### **Morning task:**

#### Reception children

#### Year 1

- Today it is grammar and we will be learning about double letters when writing verbs in the past tense which contain a short vowel, and also learning about writing verbs in the future tense
- Watch the video about 'Double letters' when a verb has a short vowel and complete the sheet with the stop watches on which is in your pack.
- Watch the video about writing verbs in the future tense and complete the sheet in your back about past and future tense including an auxiliary verb.

### **Topic:**

- Today we are going to be using a time line to see how the events of the Great Fire of London unfolded and how quickly the fire spread, which started in Pudding Lane.

- Sequence the pictures (set as a 'to do' on Purple Mash) for you to read and put in order to see how fast the fire spread!

### Forest school:

- Have a watch of the Fire safety PowerPoint on Purple Mash to learn about being safe if you are around a fire.
- In Forest school today, we will be lining up the houses the children made on Monday and setting fire to them (in the school fire pit) to show how quickly a fire would have spread in

1666 when the houses were made of wood. You may want to have a little fire (if safe to do so), but it is up to your sensible adults to decide and to keep you safe.
